What is Literature Study?	<i>Guiding Readers and Writers</i> by Fontas and Pinnell <i>The Art of Teaching Reading</i> by Lucy Calkins	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> --Use a KWL chart to find out what we already know, questions we have, and what we are learning about literature study --Using informational text, we read and think about works of literature. --We collaborate with others to reflect on, analyze, and criticize literature. --We develop and share aesthetic responses to literature. --We extend understandings through talk and/or writing.

<p>Organizational Structures for Literature Study with Informational Text</p>	<p><i>Guiding Readers and Writers</i> by Fontas and Pinnell <i>The Art of Teaching Reading</i> by Lucy Calkins</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> --Read aloud, whole group --Shared reading of text --Assign texts for students to choose and read independently, meet with small group to discuss --Give a choice of texts for student to choose and read independently, meet with small group to discuss
